Judgement Pavement, Caesarea and
Rome

Judgment Pavement of Pilate:

1. This pertains to Jesus Christ.
2. Re: A place called the "Stone Pavement." John 19:13
3. Exact location is a matter of debate.
 - a. Finegan and Vincent argue that the site was floor of the Fortress Antonia.
 - b. McRay argues for the Stone Pavement to be in Herod's palace.
 - i. Fitting for Pilate to reside therein.
 - ii. The Praetorium Guard (Mark 15:14) would have been there.
 - iii. A large podium was found that may have served as the Pavement.
 - iv. Similar to the one found in Corinth where Paul stood before Gallio (Acts 18:12).

The Northern Wall:

1. The wall does not agree with descriptions by Josephus, possibly due to one or more destructions.
2. Evidence uncovered to date appears to be rather meaningless in relation to any biblical events.

Caesarea Maritime:

1. Herod the Great built this city from "the ground up" beginning 23 or 22 B.C. Construction took 10 to 12 years.
2. Built to satisfy his vanity and that of Caesar Augustus, for whom it was named.
