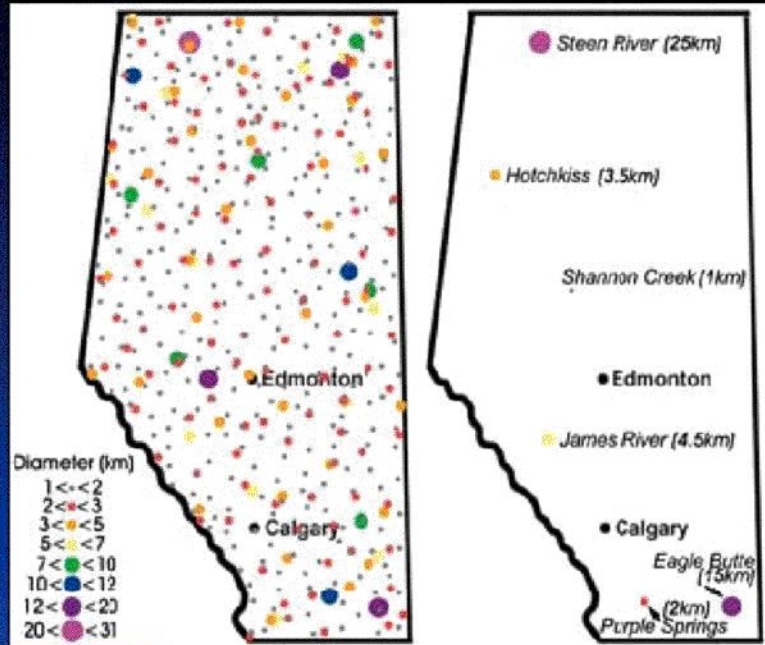


Craters, Craters, everywhere (including where they aren't)

During the past 600 MY it is expected that approximately 500 impact craters larger than 1 km in diameter have formed in Alberta. A random distribution of these impacts is shown on the left while the locations of known possible and probable impact craters is given on the right.
